Show and Tell - February 2015



Faye has been doing some wonderful poppies for ANZAC day. She showed lots of red ones but also purple ones which commemorate the horses involved in the war.

Audrey brought a stunning double sided woven wall hanging which she bought in Africa many years ago. It was made from goat mohair using natural dyes.

Ros showed a very pretty bracelet crocheted with clear beads and a coloured thread. Very effective.

Kathy brought in her new purchase of a 'Felt-O-Matic'. It is a cleverly designed and well made square instrument with multiple felting needles that allows quick felting of a large area. She also discussed her day as a fleece steward at the Alpaca Show which was very enjoyable.

Pam showed 3 trauma teddies and also a hat she is knitting straight from unspun roving. The hat looks great and Pam is planning to felt it a bit if needed to get the correct size. Good tip!

Helen discussed her visit to Peru. They still use spindles rather than spinning wheels and there is a return to using natural dyes. The cochineal beetles were being ground up to make the cochineal. Fascinating.

Kylie showed a spindle spun blue green skein using wool from the food colouring day. The colours were very vibrant. She also had a lovely skein which she had spun on the spinning wheel using several differently coloured fibres.

Christine has starting knitting a delightful wedding ring shawl using a fine yarn from the Scarf exchange and a pattern from the Guild pattern book.

Mal showed a knitted vest at a recent visit to the Guild. The yarn used was spun from a dark charcoal alpaca

fleece that was gifted to the Guild after last years Alpaca Show. He knitted it in stripes with a contrast in red and it looked very striking.

Debbie is knitting socks in an English lace pattern. The commercial yarn is very pretty but it is splitting easily which is making progress difficult.

Heather has been spinning raw linen fibre on the spinning wheel. It is producing a fine strong yarn which will soften with washing. Very interesting.

Ruth is knitting a shrug from a pure silk slubby yarn. It is a simple garter stitch but the yarn is lovely to work with.



Woven Garter Workshop

with Lynne Johnson

In this Workshop the basics of Woven Garter* will be covered and activities will include using the stitch to make a variety of knitted fabrics and shapes for a variety of purposes. * Some participants may have learned the technique as Stranded or Super Garter in recent years – this workshop will include more recent applications and samples covering a range of interests and experience.

REQUIREMENTS

The ability to cast on, cast off, knit plain and purl rows.

Knitting needles. Any or all of the following: 3.75mm, 4.00mm or 4.5mm. Circular or straight. Other thick and thin needles that you may have.

Your favourite 'toolbox' containing wool needle, scissors or clippers, and tape measure. Don't buy these especially – we'll share.

Some yarns. You will be provided with yarn for workshop projects but you might like to bring any left over yarns to augment those provided. We will be using mainly 8 and 12 ply yarns and some 4,5,6,14s etc. They can be wools, mohairs, silks, cottons, occasionally synthetics, finger ply, crepes, boucles, ribbons, combinations etc. Multi coloured yarns are particularly suitable for these workshops.


