Show and Tell – February 2015

Ruth found an interesting book which showed the *'knit one below stitch'*. She had several samples of the resulting column like pattern which involves 2 colours and uses variegated and plain yarn (commercial or hand spun) to great effect. The stitch is quite simple and she will demonstrate it the next work day 25/2/15. *Bring along either double pointed or circular needles and two contrasting yarns.*

Heather showed a very effective scarf woven on a rigid heddle in a bamboo yarn from Bendigo knitting mills. It was a houndstooth pattern which draped beautifully. She also had a lovely knitted lace pattern using alternating brown and white spindle spun alpaca. Great effort with the spindle!

Debbie had a sweet little pale pink knitted baby jacket using a Bendigo mill yarn. She also showed a toddler size vest knitted in the round in a simple but effective basket weave pattern. A pair of socks knitted in a variegated orange and red yarn with a cabled pattern were very impressive.

Pam has been busy knitting trauma teddies which are very much appreciated by sick children. She also showed a very interesting cushion knitted in the stranded garter stitch. This was done when she attended the stranded garter stitch workshop some years ago. The stranded garter stitch makes good use of 2 colours.

Christine has been doing some amazing weaving on the 8 shaft loom. She showed samples using double edges to give a firm regular edge as well as double weave which gives a nice firm cloth but can also be used to make a double layer. We are looking forward to a demonstration later in the year.

Kathy could not attend the meeting due to family commitments, but in the spirit of Wednesdays being Guild Days took her spinning wheel along to make use of an indeterminate waiting time while running "family taxi". Kathy set up in the shade of the van in a quiet and empty end of a carpark, enjoying a cool breeze while spinning thin singles. After about 15-20 minutes, a polite and bemused security person approached to enquire what was going on. Apparently a "woman spinning in the carpark" was causing no end of distractions in a nearby office! He seemed genuinely interested in the existence of the Guild, and the spinning (alpaca off course!). The offer of a coffee in their canteen was too good to pass up on so the wheel was all packed away.
